### PASTOR'S REPORT "Remembering to Breathe Along the Way"

I'm not sure about you, but 2022 seems to be starting off with just as much woe and concern as 2021. Each year it feels like we pray for a "better" year next year, yet we always feel like there is a distant hope laying off somewhere in the near to distant future. Last year we had a continued pandemic, and now this year we have the Ukraine situation and praying to avoid WWIII. I don't say this to be a Debbie Downer, but in fact quite the opposite! What I want to call our attention to is the race being run, and remind us to breathe along the way.

As we shift to the spring of 2022, I firmly believe that God is active and alive both within our own individual community and the world at large. Before I get ahead of myself, let's take a moment to reflect on Hebrews 12: 1-3 which says:

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer, and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him, he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

The two words that spring to the forefront of my mind when I read this passage are **faith** and **perseverance**. Back in the days of my camping ministry, this was one of our theme verses for the summer. It became a sort of rallying standard for campers. Though somewhat jokingly, we would cite the scripture on long hikes up the mountain whenever the kiddos started feeling weary and tired, when they felt like they couldn't make it to the top, and when they simply became toooo tired. Sometimes convincing them that they COULD do it was just as much of a challenge as the hike itself. Once we would finally get to the top of the mountain, we would all collapse onto the overlook rock, and a beautiful view was our reward for a job well done—a journey well-traveled

When Paul wrote this letter, he most likely was not referring to a physical race or trial that we are called to run, but rather a spiritual one that we are called to endure. In recent years, I think we can all relate to this very notion a little bit more closely. When global issue after global issue strikes at our hearts and minds I am reminded, "Okay, Kenny, this is a race after all. It's not all supposed to be easy."



Shifting back to the sporting metaphor, I wonder if sometimes we focus so much on the pain, that we forget to breathe and take in the view.

Like a first-time jogger taking on a 5K, up and down the harsh terrain at a muddy vineyard in Charlottesville, if we aren't careful we might get to the end of our race and realize we forgot to smile along the way. Now hopefully as the journey continues we gain some experience, condition ourselves, learn how to stride and breathe appropriately, and the race becomes more and more comfortable. But every now and then, there is sure to be a hill that surprises all of us, catching even the most veteran runner off-guard. In these moments, just breathing becomes a nice mantra...just keep on keeping on!

Now shifting this sporting metaphor back into spiritual practicality, we know that the race we run is called life. We know the obstacles we face are not solely physical but also mental and spiritual. We recognize that the experience we gain along the race is akin to wisdom from our past. We attest that the race strategies that we develop are rooted in finding rest in our Maker and Lord. We know that the surprise trials are no match for our God at the end of the day. When we begin to realize all of these things, then our perspective can begin to shift.

Instead of focusing so much on the difficulty of breathing, the aches and pains in our legs, the heaviness of our stride, once we turn our attention and focus to God and look up, we can begin seeing all of the beauty around us.

On a church level, I have been encouraged to see new ministries begin to blossom over the past half-year such as the GA's, Men's Group, Youth Group, and all of our many ministry teams. On a local level, I have been thrilled to participate in planning meetings for the WMUV, the BGAV, and the FABN. On a national level. I have been deeply moved at our response to the desperate situation of Ukraine as we become united in prayer and support for 'the least of these.' On a word level, there have been various reports that suggest 30% more people have experienced God through the pandemic than before.

Simply put, God is on the move, and if we aren't careful, we can miss the exciting things that the Lord is doing in and around us! Yes, we are running a long and challenging race; however, we have been invited to participate in something bigger than ourselves. The race we are running is not one that we are attempting to complete on our strength, but rather through God's Grace. Therefore, when things seem impossible, don't forget to breathe, don't forget that God is in control, and don't forget that there is beauty all around.

We just have to look for it.

# 125th Anniversary Celebrate with us all year long!

Our church is celebrating its 125th year in which God has blessed us to continue reaching out to our community and its needs.


Starting in 1895 when we separated from our sister church, Round Hill Baptist, our first church was on the corner of Bancroft Avenue and Jefferson Street. In 1896. we asked to be a separate church then called First Baptist Church of Colonial Beach and our first pastor was Reverend Monds. In 1924, our church moved to the corner of Washington Avenue and Dennison Street where Reverend C.W. Stokes served. Our church was growing and continued to grow in the community.

In 1959, our church bought the present-day property to build a brick sanctuary and educational building. Groundbreaking was in January 1961 and the service was held on April 1, 1962. Reverend Earl Cox was our leader at that time and in 1967 our name was switched to Colonial Beach Baptist Church.

The church added to the additional new building for more classrooms on November 12, 1989, and dedicated on October 7, 1990, under Reverend Steve DeVane's leadership.

It's time to catch up and share news from the infamous RA Room and what the crew has been up to these past few weeks. Our room is full of energy each Wednesday night as we welcome our crew of six: Robert, Lewis, Tucker, Drew, Christopher, and Terrence. They are a great group of boys to work with as they learn more about RA's, the lives and the work of missionaries both in the United States and other countries around the world, and how they can reach out and be missionaries in their own community here in Colonial Beach.

We begin each Wednesday evening with a little bit of recreation and the ever-present snack-important and much anticipated parts of the night as they simply enjoy being with each other. We recite the RA Pledge and examine one portion of the pledge each week. They are becoming quite proficient with reciting it and join in the discussion of what each phrase means.

In March, our missionary study was about Victor and Ludy Moura, who lived in Brazil, where he pastored a church and Ludy was a lawyer for the government. After visiting his friend in Boston, Victor became aware that there were more than 500,000 Brazilians living in New England, and many of them did not have a relationship with Christ. Upon returning to Brazil, they made the decision to move to Boston, Massachusetts, to start a church for Brazilians there.

April will bring discussion of the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering and the support of North American missionaries. We will also be learning about Arc and Rachel Crownover and their family of three and the missionary work in Germany as they serve there as church planters.

May will be our final month of meetings for RA's until fall. We will close our RA year with a celebration yet to be planned. In the meantime, we will focus our May study on a missionary initiative called Begin Anew in Nashville, Tennessee. This ministry shares the gospel message with people in poverty in the Nashville area and how we, like those working in Nashville, can honor God by caring for people in need.

I am thankful for "OUR SIX" and for my faithful helper Alice Wilkerson who is always there to help and encourage the boys and has such patience with my "messiness." It continues to be a great RA season and we are blessed every Wednesday night by their presence.
